

About the Academy

The ICLD Local Democracy Academy is an intensive academic program that brings together an international group of leading scholars for a week of mutual learning, critical thinking and joint exploration of new ideas to foster a more inclusive local democracy on a global scale.

The Academies should result in comparative and innovative research proposals, cutting edge papers, and a dynamic network of scholars interested in the role of cities and local governments in development. Following the conference, ICLD invites the participants of the Academy to submit proposals for funding of research networks.

In the ever-evolving landscape of global challenges, elected local governments can catalyse higher-scale transformative change. Join us at the 4th Local Democracy Academy, an action-research conference gathering change-makers dedicated to understanding and harnessing the power of democratic innovations. Participants will engage in thought-provoking discussions, share groundbreaking research, and collaboratively explore instances where local governments have acted as architects of global transformation.

Goals and Objectives:

Identify and analyse challenges experienced by democratic local governments to provide policy recommendations.

Examine how local governments can fight anti-democratic trends at the national global level.

Co-design research initiatives to explore and address complex local democratic challenges.

What to expect?

The Academy is built around real-world problems and challenges identified by local governments in the ICLD network. At the Academy, researchers will:

- ▶ Present their research around the key themes of the conference.
- ▶ Participate in Local Democracy Labs and use their expertise to discuss ways of addressing the challenges identified by local governments.
- ▶ Build capacity for impact-oriented research.
- Co-create ideas for research proposals and policy briefs.

Thematic sessions and faculty

The academy is organised around thematic sessions departing from paper presentation, where participants will receive and provide feedback on their research. Participants are expected to contribute, read, write, and actively engage during the entire week.

The academy is divided into the following sessions:

Child and Youth Inclusion

This thematic group focuses on the role that local governments play in including children and youth in decision-making that affects their futures. ICLD is supporting local governments in southern and eastern Africa with projects on youth and children participation, education, and sustainability.

Democratic Resilience – Civic Engagement

This thematic group focuses on the role that local governments play in building democratic resilience in the face of crises, polarization, and autocratization. ICLD is supporting local governments in Ukraine, Bosnia & Herzegovina, and Kosovo with projects around peacebuilding, preparedness, and the strengthening of democratic institutions.

Climate Action

This thematic group focuses on the role that local governments can and should play in climate change adaptation and mitigation.
