What an output is and is not

- It is not an intention.
- It is not an idea.
- It is something that is **completed**, that can be shown or verified.
- An output is a **concrete and verifiable result** that a project produces within a given period.

Characteristics of the *output*

S - Specific: It is well-defined and clear, without ambiguities.

M - Measurable: It is easy to know if it has been achieved.

A - Achievable: It is realistic and feasible with the current resources.

R - Relevant: It is connected to the overall purpose and strategy.

T - Time-bound: It has defined dates.

The output is connected to the broader goals and objectives of the project, and it directly contributes to their achievement.

Goal: create more inclusive public spaces



Objective: involve girls and young women in decisions about public spaces



Output: within **six months, we will have the **design of XX parks**, taking into account the preferences and needs of young women.**

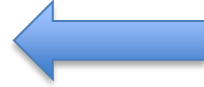

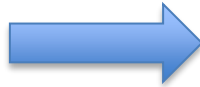
